



The Environmental Walking Tour and Non-formal Educational Activities event took place in Prague–Kolovraty on 23 and 25 April 2026. The event was organised by the Municipality of Prague–Kolovraty as part of the Youth Municipal Climate Action — YMCA project. It connected film education, environmental awareness, community participation, practical sustainability activities and intergenerational exchange.

#### 23 APRIL: Film screenings for students

The first part of the event was dedicated to film screenings for students. The programme presented selected documentaries from the One World film festival, organised by the humanitarian organisation People in Need. The films addressed current global and social challenges, including human rights, environmental issues, war conflicts, the impacts of artificial intelligence and the risks connected with modern technologies.

The screenings included A Free Daughter of Free Kyrgyzstan, In the Belly of AI, Cuba & Alaska, and Dangerous Games: Roblox and the Metaverse Exposed. Each screening was followed by a discussion, giving students the opportunity to reflect on the topics presented in the films, share their views and connect global challenges with their own local environment and everyday life.

#### 25 APRIL: Community environmental programme in Prague–Kolovraty

The second part of the event took place on 25 April and was designed as a community-based environmental and educational day in different locations across Prague–Kolovraty. The programme involved local schools, community organisations, children, families, volunteers and international project partners.

A plant SWAP was organised together with the creation of a new flower bed, supporting the idea of sharing, re-use, biodiversity and practical care for public space. Several creative and educational workshops were held, including activities with natural materials, ceramics, sand art, collective artwork, playful construction activities and other forms of hands-on learning.

The programme also included an exhibition of children's works from the Kolovraty kindergarten, showing how environmental topics can be introduced from an early age. Local organisations contributed with activities focused on sustainability, outdoor education and community engagement. These included the improvement of an outdoor classroom at the forest kindergarten, activities on the scout grounds connected with the idea of a living garden, family workshops, and educational activities prepared by young firefighters on safety for people, animals and forests.

Another part of the programme took place in Chadovo Sad, where participants could visit the orchard, spend time outdoors and take part in an informal community gathering. Across all locations, the event encouraged active participation, cooperation between generations and practical engagement with the local environment.

A final focus group with partners' representatives, local organizations' representatives, and local youth's representatives was held in the city center. Participants discussed both events organized in Kolovraty and drafted some ideas for the Manifesto to bring with them for the following event in Romania (final event of the project). This session created the basis for deeper and more aware approaches for the future of this project and for the creation of the final Manifesto.

The event directly contributed to the objectives of the YMCA project by promoting environmental awareness, active citizenship and youth participation in local community life. It also showed how municipalities, schools, local associations and citizens can work together to create accessible, practical and inclusive activities that strengthen community ties and support climate-conscious behaviour at the local level.
